15 Countries Trained by SME Corp. Malaysia and JICA in the Third Country Training Programme (TCTP) on SME Development for African Countries Marking the 40th Anniversary of the Look East Policy

Kuala Lumpur, 7 - 10 March 2022 – In fostering regional and sub-regional technical cooperation, particularly among developing countries, SME Corp. Malaysia collaborated with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Malaysia (MOFA) and the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to organise the Third Country Training Programme (TCTP) 2022 on SME Development for African Countries which took place virtually from 7 to 10 March 2022 in Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

The Opening Ceremony of the programme was graced by the Chief Executive Officer of SME Corp. Malaysia, Mr. Rizal Nainy and the Mr. Takizawa Masahiko, Chief Representative of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) on 7 March 2022. In his opening address, Mr. Rizal Nainy emphasises that it was crucial to recognise the integral role of SMEs in shaping the future and must constantly look at new and alternative ways to address ongoing challenges. Mr. Takizawa highlighted in his special remarks that this year marks the 40th Anniversary of the Look East Policy announced by the Malaysian government in 1982, and the 30th anniversary of cooperation in joint international training programmes between the Government of Malaysia and Japan. Building on the successes in the last 3 decades, JICA aims to strive further in enhancing joint endeavours with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia (MOFA) and SME Corp. Malaysia.

The Programme culminated on 10 March 2022 with a Closing Ceremony in the presence of YBhg. Dato' Sri Syed Hussien Al Habshee, Chairman of SME Corp. Malaysia. In his keynote speech during the ceremony, he reiterated the importance of ensuring that a successful cooperation can only come from the collective effort of the stakeholders. Ms. Hafizah Abdullah, Undersecretary, International Cooperation and Development Division (ICADD) who was also in attendance at the Closing Ceremony expressed hope that the training programme would strengthen friendly exchanges and create opportunities for further mutually beneficial engagements and strong people-to-people ties across a wide range of sectors and interests.

This year, the capacity-building training programme under the ambit of the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Program (MTCP) centres around the sharing of Malaysia and Japan's experience in SME development with special emphasis on COVID-19 recovery measures for SMEs with selected African countries. Participants from Kenya, Mauritius, and Uganda joined the TCTP alumni this year making a total of 150 participants from 15 African countries successfully trained by SME Corp. Malaysia since the inception of the Programme in 2011. The Programme forms strong commitments of the Government of Malaysia towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries by providing a platform to share experiences, knowledge, and technology to the chosen countries that will benefit from the exchange of information while enabling SME development stakeholders from Malaysia to strengthen network and outreach globally.

In 2007, SMIDEC was mandated by the National SME Development Council chaired by the YAB Prime Minister to formulate comprehensive policies and strategies for SMEs and drive SME programs across Ministries and Agencies. Accordingly, SMIDEC has been officially rebranded as SME Corp. Malaysia on 2 October 2009.






